KERRY J. ALLEN SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

The Kerry J. Allen Scholarship is provided annually on behalf of a national board of benefactors and contributors from the Church of Christ (Holiness) USA and from other interested contributors. Scholarships will be awarded each year at the National Church of Christ (Holiness) USA Congress Convention.

Applicants applying for the Kerry J. Allen Scholarship must meet the following criteria:

AGE REQUIREMENT

An applicant cannot be older than 24-years-old when applying for the scholarship. Applicants applying for the scholarship at the age of 24 will only be eligible to receive funds for one year. No funds will be issued after age 25 regardless of the remaining college term. The scholarship was established to provide scholarships to students under the age of 25.

ENROLLMENT STATUS

All applicants must be undergraduates and enrolled full time, with a minimum of 12 credit hours, to be considered for the KJA Scholarship. All applicants must provide proof of full-time, undergraduate enrollment <u>before funds are disbursed</u>.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants must compete on four levels: <u>Local, District, Diocese, and National</u>. At each level, one (1) applicant will be recognized and will advance to the next level. During the National Congress Convention, scholarship amounts determined by the Board will be awarded to designated recipients. The final decision of awards distributed will be made by the KJA Scholarship Board.

APPLICANT APPLICATION CRITERIA FOR THE KERRY J. ALLEN SCHOLARSHIP

Points will not be given for areas of *Requirements* and *Documentation*. However, all of the requirements must be met, and all supporting documents must be included for the application to be considered. The score values indicated for *Accomplishments*, *Essay*, and *Interview* represent the maximum number of points that can be received in that particular category.

1.	REQUIREMENTS (Applicant must meet all of the following requirements):		
		Must be an active member of the Church of Christ (Holiness) USA;	
		Must be an active member of their Local Sunday School and/or HYM;	
		Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 from high school or college;	
		Must be a graduating high school senior or a full-time undergraduate college student;	
		Must agree to become a scholarship financial benefactor upon completion of college by giving annually to this award (becoming an Alumni Contributor) and by assisting in fund-raising endeavors.	
		As long as all criteria are met annually, scholarships will be distributed (when funds are available), for a maximum of four consecutive years. There can be no breaks during the four-year term of the Award. Recipients must ensure to meet all guidelines and deadlines on an annual basis to prevent termination of the Award. Once an Award has been terminated, it will not be reinstated.

		Letter of recommendation from Sunday School Superintendent or HYM Group Leader;	
		Letter of recommendation from High School/College Counselor or Teacher;	
		An application signed by both the District and Diocese Congress Presidents respectively;	
		Completed application scoring sheets from District and Diocese levels including names of judges;	
		A college letter of acceptance from at least one College (for first time applications);	
		A 3x5 photo should be provided.
