### KERRY J. ALLEN SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA (Revised October-2022)

The Kerry J. Allen Scholarship is provided annually on behalf of a national board of benefactors and contributors from the Church of Christ (Holiness) USA and from other interested contributors. Scholarships will be awarded each year at the National Church of Christ (Holiness) USA Congress Convention.

Applicants applying for the Kerry J. Allen Scholarship must meet the following criteria:

#### <u>AGE REQUIREMENT</u>

An applicant cannot be older than 24-years-old when applying for the scholarship. Applicants applying for the scholarship at the age of 24 will only be eligible to receive funds for one year. No funds will be issued after age 25 regardless of the remaining college term. The scholarship was established to provide scholarships to students under the age of 25.

#### • ENROLLMENT STATUS

All applicants must be undergraduates and enrolled full time, with a minimum of 12 credit hours, to be considered for the KJA Scholarship. All applicants must provide proof of fulltime, undergraduate enrollment <u>before funds are disbursed</u>.

#### <u>APPLICATION PROCESS</u>

Applicants will need to turn in the following to their diocese presidents to be considered for a KJA scholarship: A completed Scholarship application that is signed by the applicants diocese president, a 350 word essay, a high school transcript, and a college acceptance letter. The final decision of awards distributed will be made by the KJA Scholarship Board.

# APPLICANT APPLICATION CRITERIA FOR THE KERRY J. ALLEN SCHOLARSHIP

#### (Revised October-2022)

Points will not be given for areas of *Requirements* and *Documentation*. However, all of the

requirements must be met, and all supporting documents must be included for the application to be

considered. The score values indicated for Essay and Interview represent the maximum number of points

that can be received in that particular category.

#### 1. **REQUIREMENTS** (Applicant must meet all of the following

requirements): Must be an active member of the Church of Christ

(Holiness) USA; Must be an active member of their Local Sunday

School and/or HYM;

Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 from high school or college;

Must be a graduating high school senior or a full-time undergraduate college student;

Must agree to become a scholarship financial benefactor upon completion of college by giving annually to this award (becoming an Alumni Contributor) and by assisting in fund-raising endeavors.

As long as all criteria are met annually, scholarships will be distributed (when funds are available), for a **maximum of four consecutive years. There can be no breaks during the four-year term of the Award.** Recipients must ensure to meet all guidelines and deadlines on an annual basis to prevent termination of the Award. Once an Award has been terminated, it will not be reinstated.

### 2. DOCUMENTATION (Applicant must provide the following):

Official high school and/or college transcript;

Letter of recommendation from Pastor, HYM Group Leader, or Superintendent

An application signed by the applicants Diocese Congress Presidents

A college letter of acceptance from at least one College (for first time applications)

A 3x5 photo should be provided.

**3. ESSAY:** Each applicant must write an essay, not to exceed 350 words typed and double-spaced, describing how they plan to give back to the community and church upon completion of their degree.

4. **INTERVIEW:** Each applicant will be interviewed by the National Scholarship Committee.
